Programme Overview

The Challenge

- Invasive alien plant clearing often happens **once-off**, is rarely **coordinated** across landscapes, and is seldom **financially self-sustaining** in the long term.
- With increasing **wildfire risk** and **loss of bioversity** under a **changing climate**, sustained clearing, maintenance, and ecological restoration have become critical.

How SSN's Programme Aims to Addresss it

- An innovative **grants mechanism** enabling access to financial and capacity support
- A **coordinated ecosystem of actors** within the value chain
- Demonstrating **viable approaches and models** for alien invasive plant management and fynbos restoration
- Supporting local, ecosystem based **livelihood opportunities**; especially for women



Programme Approach

The programme will support financially sustainable and coordinated approaches to:

- The sustained **removal and long-term maintenance** (including biological control measures) of **woody invasive alien plants** such as Rooikraans, Wattle and Eucalyptus ect.
- The **beneficiation and productive use of cleared biomass** (e.g. fuelwood, chipping, composting, biochar)
- The **recovery and rewilding of indigenous fynbos ecosystems** (e.g. fynbos nurseries, beekeepers, and other nature/ ecosystem-based activities)

- An innovative small grants mechanism has leveraged a **scalable business model** for **restoration** of critical biodiverse ecosystems and local **socio-economic development**.

Operational Expenses

What Grants Can't be Used For:

- ✗ Profit, unrestricted income or working capital

ALL applicants must have:

- Verified legal status in South Africa
- Evidence of good standing
- Basic governance structure
- Basic financial capability
- Procurement ability
- Relevant experience or capacity
- Landscape fit
- Programme aims fit
- Willingness to participate in sandboxing, innovation and capacity building
- Basic project data management and reporting capacity

Sub Grantee Applicants must have:

- Non-profit legal status
- Ability to coordinate activities and manage landowner relationships
- Ability to contract, support and supervise actors undertaking clearing activities
- Ability to manage equipment & assets responsibly
- Organisational capacity: audited or scale appropriate accounts; demonstrated project/financial management

Micro Grantee Applicants must have:

- Registered SMMEs / CBOs / Cooperatives / NPOs
- Practical delivery capacity for the envisaged work within the grant period (people, time, basic systems).
- Ability to manage project assets/ equipment and keep records



Assessment Principles

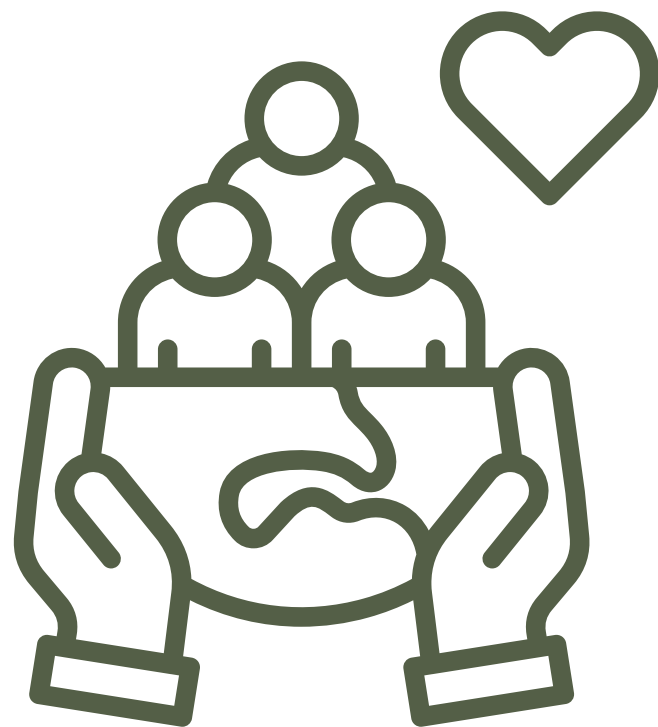

ALL contracted entities are required to comply with the responsibilities set out in the grant agreement including:

Financial Management & Compliance



- Use grant funds only for **pre-approved project activities**.
- Keep **financial records**, including receipts and time tracking where applicable.
- Follow the required **procurement protocol** when purchasing goods or services.
- Ensure no use of **prohibited substances or activities** listed in the **Exclusion Criteria**.
- Ensure no introduction of **non-approved biological agents**.
- **Comply** with all local environmental, labour, and safety **regulations**.
- Keep relevant Monitoring & Evaluation (M&E) data.

Safeguards: Environmental, Social, and Health & Safety

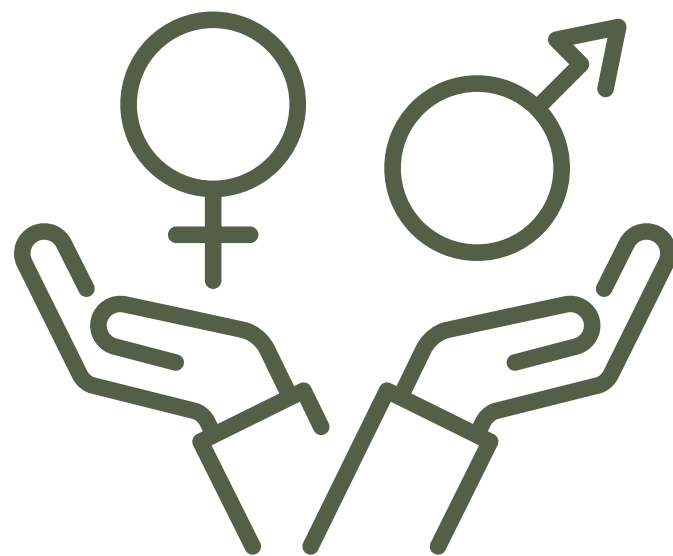

Key requirements and considerations: Exclusion Criteria

Environmental Exclusions



- Activities prohibited by **legislation** in South Africa or by international conventions to protect resources, biodiversity or cultural heritage
- Activities contributing to **destruction or impairment of areas and ecosystems (conservation areas, critical habitats) that merit protection** or require offsetting
- Activities contributing to **introduction or spread of invasive species**
- Introduction of **non-native plant or animal species** introduced to a new geographical area that are not yet present in the project area (including biological controls|)
- Activities contributing to **deforestation of primary** (indigenous, native) forests
- Manufacture, sale or use of **living modified organisms**
- Activities requiring **animal testing**
- Production, sale or use of **radioactive material**
- Manufacture, sale or use of listed **active pesticide ingredients** and **substances** and/or categorised as **Persistent Organic Pollutants (POPs), ozone-depleting substances (ODS), hazardous**, acutely or chronically **toxic**, carcinogenic, mutagenic or reproductive toxicants
- Violations on national or international rules on: **phase-out/prohibition or international ban** on pharmaceuticals; toxic substances; protected animals, plants or plant products (CITES); destructive fishing methods; cross-border trade in waste (Basel Convention)
- Activities promoting, prospecting, exploring or **exploiting coal, oil, natural gas and radioactive resources** to generate energy

Social Exclusions



- Forced or harmful **child labour** (ILO core labour standards)
- Forced **evictions or displacement** of indigenous people violating UN principles/guidelines
- Activities **directly impacting land** belonging to or used by **indigenous people** without appropriate consultations corresponding to international law
- Activities that promote or facilitate **exploitative, harmful, or ethically sensitive commercial practices**, including but not limited to prostitution, pornography, or gambling.
- Activities that produce, distribute, or endorse **media or materials that undermine human dignity, equality, inclusion, democratic values, or social cohesion**, including discriminatory or hate-based content.

Product Exclusions

- These **substances, chemicals and products** are **NOT** permitted for funding, procurement, use or support under this programme.
- These criteria **apply to all grantees**, their **partners**, and **all contractors/service providers**, and cover both **Capex and Opex**.
- Any products containing active ingredients listed below, categorised as **Persistent Organic Pollutants (POPs), ozone-depleting substances (ODS), hazardous, acutely or chronically toxic, carcinogenic, mutagenic or reproductive toxicants**.
- These are **PROHIBITED** and will **NOT be permitted for procurement and use** in the project



Common Ingredients include:

Fipronil, clothianidin, imidacloprid, thiamethoxam, glyphosate or total herbicides with similar effects, Dichlorodiphenyltrichloroethane (DDT), Lindane, Endosulfan, Methamidophos, Methyl-parathion, Monocrotophos and Methyl Bromide.



Requirements for Grantees

If a grantee (or their service provider) **intends to use any chemicals, pesticides, plant protection product or biocide** as part of funded project activities, they must:

- Confirm in their expression of interest application that none of their products contain active ingredients in the prohibited list
- Provide a list of products and active ingredients they intend to use at due diligence stage
- In exceptional cases, the use of certain active ingredients may be considered, subject to prior written approval and a detailed technical justification.
